Panchishkin, 2013-04-17 Preface Among the various branches of mathematics number theory is characterized to a lesser degree by its primary subject integers than by a psychological attitude Actually number theory also deals with rational algebraic and transcendental numbers with some very specific analytic functions such as Dirichlet series and modular forms and with some geometric objects such as lattices and schemes over \mathbb{Z} The question whether a given article belongs to number theory is answered by its author's system of values If arithmetic is not there the paper will hardly be considered as number theoretical even if it deals exclusively with integers and congruences On the other hand any mathematical tool say homotopy theory or dynamical systems may become an important source of number theoretical inspiration For this reason combinatorics and the theory of recursive functions are not usually associated with number theory whereas modular functions are In this report we interpret number theory broadly There are compelling reasons to adopt this viewpoint First of all the integers constitute together with geometric images one of the

Panchishkin, 2006-03-30 This edition has been called startlingly up to date and in this corrected second printing you can be sure that it is even more contemporaneous It surveys from a unified point of view both the modern state and the trends of continuing development in various branches of number theory Illuminated by elementary problems the central ideas of modern theories are laid bare Some topics covered include non Abelian generalizations of class field theory recursive computability and Diophantine equations zeta and L functions This substantially revised and expanded new edition contains several new sections such as Wiles proof of Fermat's Last Theorem and relevant techniques coming from a synthesis of various theories **European Congress of Mathematics** Ari Laptev, 2005 The European Congress of Mathematics held every four years has established itself as a major international mathematical event Following those in Paris 1992 Budapest 1996 and Barcelona 2000 the Fourth European Congress of Mathematics took place in Stockholm Sweden June 27 to July 2 2004 with 913 participants from 65 countries Apart from seven plenary and thirty three invited lectures there were six Science Lectures covering the most relevant aspects of

Introduction to Complex Hyperbolic Spaces Serge Lang, 2013-03-09 Since the appearance of Kobayashi's book there have been several results at the basic level of hyperbolic spaces for instance Brody's theorem and results of Green Kiernan Kobayashi Noguchi etc which make it worthwhile to have a systematic exposition Although of necessity I reproduce some theorems from Kobayashi I take a different direction with different applications in mind so the present book does not supersede Kobayashi's My interest in these matters stems from their relations with diophantine geometry Indeed if X is a projective variety over the complex numbers then I conjecture that X is hyperbolic if and only if X has only a finite number of rational points in every finitely generated field over the rational numbers There are also a number of subsidiary conjectures related to this one These conjectures are qualitative Vojta has made quantitative conjectures by relating the Second Main Theorem of Nevanlinna theory to the theory of heights and he has conjectured bounds on heights stemming from inequalities having to do with diophantine approximations and implying both classical and modern conjectures Noguchi has looked at the function field case and made substantial progress after the line started by Grauert and Grauert Reckziegel and continued by a recent paper of Riebeschl The book is divided into three main parts the basic complex analytic theory differential geometric aspects and Nevanlinna theory Several chapters of this book are logically independent of each other

Singularities and Complex Geometry Qikeng Lu, 1997 This book presents the proceedings of the joint U S China Seminar on Singularity and Complex Geometry held at the Institute of Mathematics of the Chinese Academy Beijing in June 1994 This was the first gathering of Chinese and American mathematicians working in these fields several Japanese mathematicians also took part The volume covers a wide range of problems in areas such as CR manifolds value distribution theory of holomorphic curves topology of the complements of algebraic plane curves with singularities and arrangements topology of non isolated singularities gauge theory on resolutions of simple singularities and residues of foliations The articles give accounts of research in these fast developing areas Much of the material appears here for the first time in print Titles in this series are co published with International Press Cambridge MA USA

Hilbert's Tenth Problem: Relations with Arithmetic and Algebraic Geometry Jan Denef, 2000 This book is the result of a meeting that took place at the University of Ghent Belgium on the relations between Hilbert's tenth problem arithmetic and algebraic geometry Included are written articles detailing the lectures that were given as well as contributed papers on current topics of interest The following areas are addressed an

historical overview of Hilbert's tenth problem Hilbert's tenth problem for various rings and fields model theory and local global principles including relations between model theory and algebraic groups and analytic geometry conjectures in arithmetic geometry and the structure of diophantine sets for example with Mazur's conjecture Lang's conjecture and Bombieri's problem and results on the complexity of diophantine geometry highlighting the relation to the theory of computation The volume allows the reader to learn and compare different approaches arithmetical geometrical topological model theoretical and computational to the general structural analysis of the set of solutions of polynomial equations It would make a nice contribution to graduate and advanced graduate courses on logic algebraic geometry and number theory

The Dynamical Mordell-Lang Conjecture Jason P. Bell, Dragos Ghioca, Thomas J. Tucker, 2016-04-20 The Dynamical Mordell Lang Conjecture is an analogue of the classical Mordell Lang conjecture in the context of arithmetic dynamics It predicts the behavior of the orbit of a point x under the action of an endomorphism f of a quasiprojective complex variety X More precisely it claims that for any point x in X and any subvariety V of X the set of indices n such that the n th iterate of x under f lies in V is a finite union of arithmetic progressions In this book the authors present all known results about the Dynamical Mordell Lang Conjecture focusing mainly on a p -adic approach which provides a parametrization of the orbit of a point under an endomorphism of a variety

New Computational Paradigms Barry S. Cooper, Benedikt Löwe, 2005-05-20 This book constitutes the refereed proceedings of the first International Conference on Computability in Europe CiE 2005 held in Amsterdam The Netherlands in June 2005 The 68 revised full papers presented were carefully reviewed and selected from 144 submissions Among them are papers corresponding to two tutorials six plenary talks and papers of six special sessions involving mathematical logic and computer science at the same time as offering the methodological foundations for models of computation The papers address many aspects of computability in Europe with a special focus on new computational paradigms These include first of all connections between computation and physical systems e.g. quantum and analog computation neural nets molecular computation but also cover new perspectives on models of computation arising from basic research in mathematical logic and theoretical computer science

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
