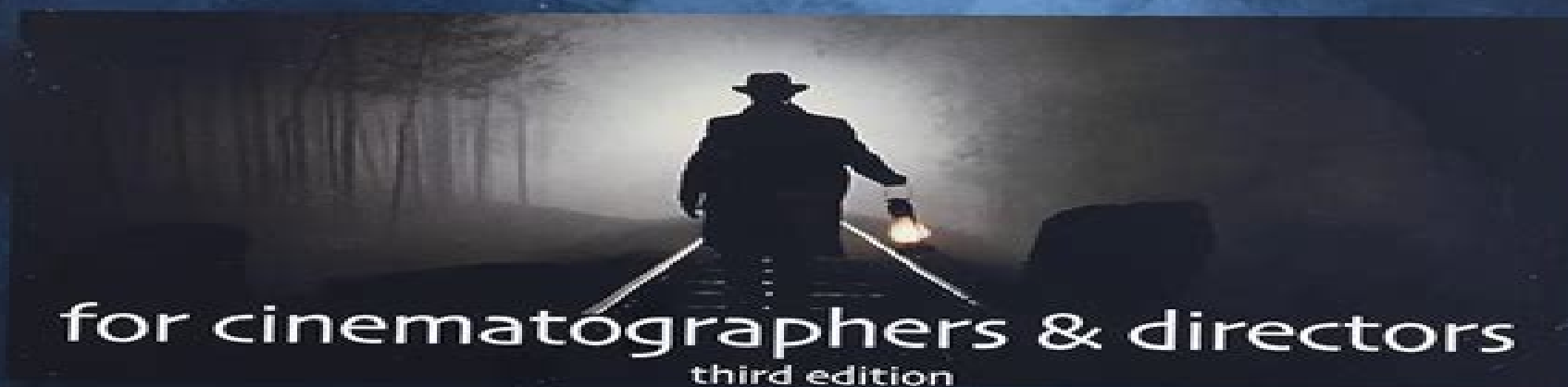

surveillance and the invention/discovery of the videographic psyche by artists, therapists and filmmakers.
