democracy espoused by the Mexican elite Japanese Mexicans were in fact victims of racial prejudice bolstered by the political alliances between the United States and Mexico The treatment of the ethnic Japanese in Mexico was even harsher than what Japanese immigrants and their children in the United States endured during the war according to Chew She argues that the number of persons affected during World War II extended beyond the first generation Japanese immigrants handled by the Mexican government during this period noting instead that the entire multiethnic social fabric of the borderlands was reconfigured by the absence of Japanese Mexicans
