of transformative change enacted by Black characters in the face of the discursive practices of whiteness in the everyday life. These novels celebrate multifarious representations of black individuals who are capable of using their agency to subvert White discursive power in finding ways in their personal and grassroots activism to transform the culture of fear that locates Blackness as such in an attempt to make a difference in the American society at large.
