CBM has been linked to:

- Improved student academic outcomes
- More effective instruction
- Higher student achievement
- Increased student responsibility for learning
- Relationship between CBM and high stakes testing
- Better communication between parents and teachers

Characteristics of CBM:

- Used to monitor student progress across an entire year
- Probes are brief and easy to administer
- Administered weekly or as benchmarks and administered the same way each time
- Each probe samples curriculum for an entire school year
- Each probe is different, but each form assesses the same types of skills at same level of difficulty
- CBM can be used to:
 - Monitor student learning outcomes
 - Identify at-risk students
 - Evaluate intervention effectiveness
 - Guide instruction and cue instructional changes
 - Measure AYP
 - Monitor annual goals and objectives
