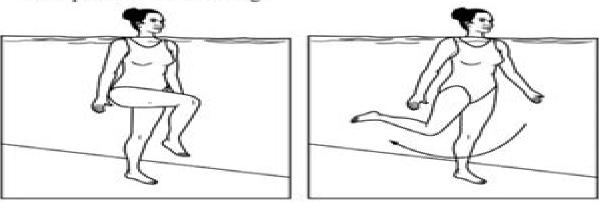


- 1. Pull one knee up bent at 90 degrees in front of your body.
