What defines post 9/11 America as a nation that is consumed by the fear of racialized terrorists is its roots in the fear of uncontrollable Blackness as excess and ominous threat in the domestic terrain through which the ideology of White supremacy has constructed for governing through Whiteness. African American urban novels published in the twenty first century respond to the discursive power of normative Whiteness that regulates black bodies selves and lives. This book demonstrates how black people contest white dominant social spaces as sites of black criminality and exclusion in an attempt to resignify them as the sites of black transformative change through personal and grassroots activism through their performativity of Blackness as an agential identity formation in their interpersonal urban social encounters with white people. Hence the vulnerable spaces of Whiteness
