PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING

- The terms Public Health Nursing and Community Health Nursing are often synonymous or interchangeable. The differences are reflected in these definitions:
- **Freeman (1963)**
 - "A field of professional practice in nursing and in public health in which technical, nursing, interpersonal analytical and organizational skills are applied to problems of health as they affect the community."
 - More on science.
- **World Health Organization (WHO)**
 - "A field of nursing that combines skills of nursing, public health and some phases of social assistance, and functions as a part of total public health programs for the promotion of health, the improvement of conditions in the social and physical environment, rehabilitation and prevention of illness and disability."
- **American Public Health Association Committee on Public Health Nursing (1996)**
 - "Public Health Nursing is the practice of promoting and protecting the health of populations using knowledge from nursing, social and public health sciences."

COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING

- **American Nurses Association (1980)**
 - "Community Health Nursing is a synthesis of nursing practice and public health practice applied to promoting and preserving the health of the populations. The practice is general and comprehensive. It is not limited to a particular age-group or diagnosis, and is continuing, not episodic. The dominant responsibility is to the population as a whole; nursing directed to individuals, families or groups contributes to the health of the total population." (generalized and comprehensive approach; no particular age grp)
- **American Nurses Association (1980)**
 - "Health promotion, health maintenance, health education and management, coordination and continuity of care are utilized in the holistic approach to the management of health care to individuals, families and groups in the community." (holistic)
- **Department of Health (DOH)**
 - "Community health nursing is a unique blend of nursing and public health practice woven into a human service that properly developed and applied has a tremendous impact on human well-being."
