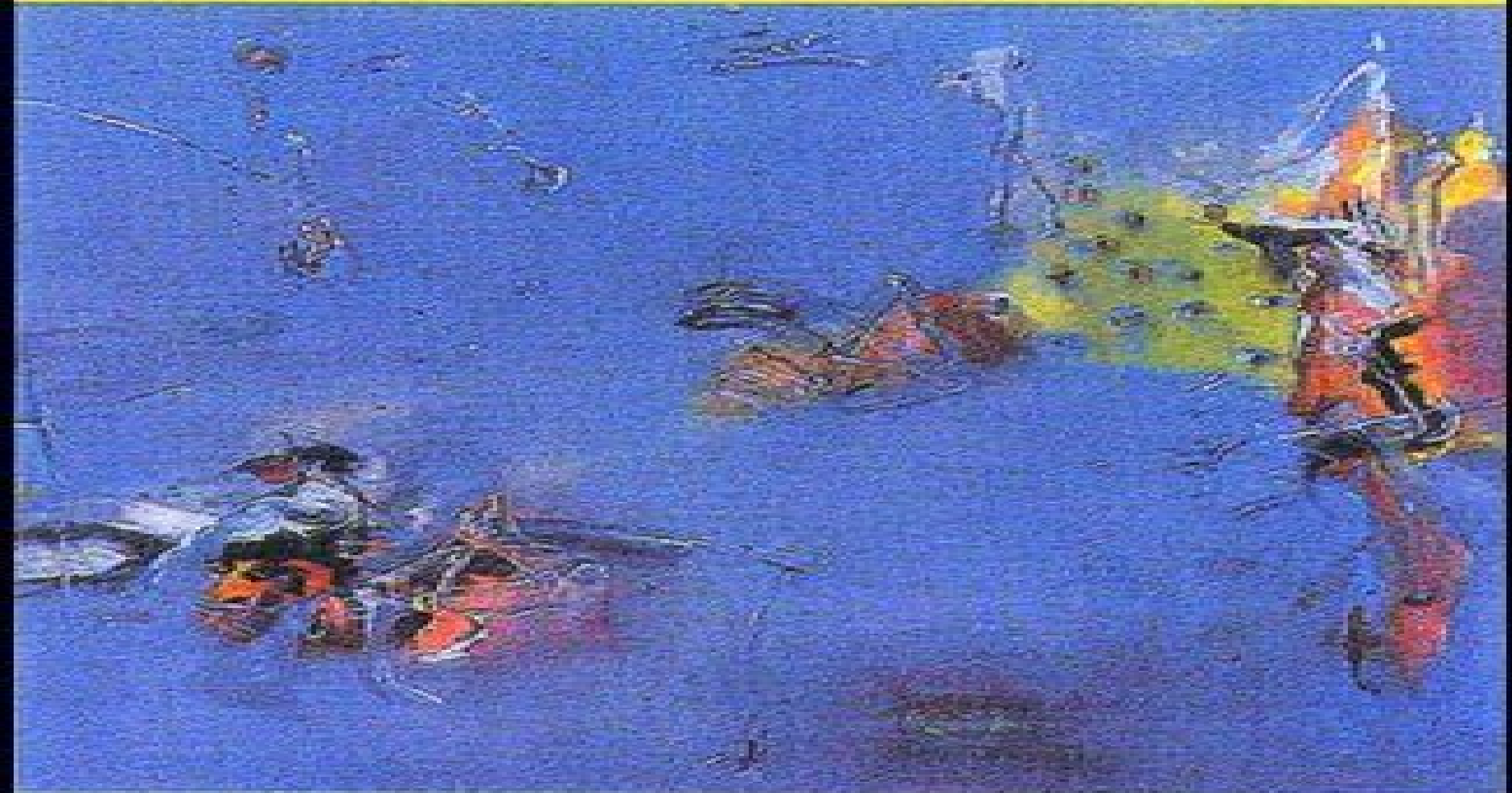

them can be found in the novels of my comparison I have chosen *White Teeth* because it is a novel that deals with the colonial past and the postcolonial present and I have selected *Small Island* because it is a novel that deals with migration in the past *Small Island* is set at the beginning
