Hill, 1993-06-03 In Responsibility and evidence in oral discourse twelve prominent linguists and linguistic anthropologists examine responsibility authority and knowledge central but problematic concepts in contemporary anthropology Their detailed case studies analyze diverse forms of oral discourse everyday conversation conversational narrative song oratory divination and ritual poetry in societies in the Americas Africa Asia and the Pacific The studies show how speakers attribute responsibility for acts and states of affairs how particular forms of language and discourse relate to claims and disclaimers of responsibility and how verbal acts are themselves social acts subject to such attributions The volume challenges those cognitive theorists who locate responsibility for the meaning of verbal acts solely in the intentions of individual speakers Instead the contributors focus on the production of meaning between speakers and audiences in particular social and cultural contexts through dialogue and interaction which mediate between linguistic forms and their interpretations This landmark volume will serve for years to come as a point of reference in the study not only of responsibility and evidence but of reported speech authorship and other phenomena in the social life of language Besides linguistic and cultural anthropologists linguistics and folklorists it will interest also readers from pragmatics legal studies sociology religion and social psychology

Speech and Thought Representation in English Lieven Vandelanotte, 2009-07-14 This book aims to provide a new linguistically grounded typology of speech and thought representation in English on the basis of the systematic study of deictic syntactic and semantic properties of authentic

examples drawn from literary as well as non literary sources In the area beyond direct and indirect speech or thought free indirect discourse has often been implicitly treated as a residual category that can accommodate anything that is neither one nor the other This book takes a fresh look at the evidence in the area of deixis particularly through a close study of pronoun and proper name use and proposes to distinguish the more character oriented free indirect type from a narrator oriented distancing indirect type which is grammatically wholly structured from the narrator s deictic standpoint Unlike free indirect representations which coherently represent the character s viewpoint the distancing indirect type sees narrators appropriating character discourse for their own purposes which may for instance be ironic The distinctions thus drawn shed new light on the much debated dual voice approach to free indirect discourse Included in the scope of this book are subjectified uses of clauses such as I think which no longer primarily construe a cognition process but rather come to function as hedges Such speaker encoding uses are argued to involve an interpersonal type of structure not based on complementation whereas the non subjectified cases receive an interclausal complementation analysis which does not have recourse to the problematic notion of reporting verb This monograph is mainly of interest to researchers and graduate students interested in the syntax semantics and pragmatics of reported speech viewed from a constructional perspective

The positionings individuals take up or refute indicate that the performance of doing Swiss is not only discursively co constructed but a site where the negotiation of meaning emerges within the context of social interaction.

Reported Discourse Tom Güldemann, Manfred von Roncador, 2002-09-24. The present volume unites 15 papers on reported discourse from a wide genetic and geographical variety of languages. Besides the treatment of traditional problems of reported discourse like the classification of its intermediate categories the book reflects in particular how its grammatical semantic and pragmatic properties have repercussions in other linguistic domains like tense aspect modality evidentiality reference tracking and pronominal categories and the grammaticalization history of quotative constructions.
